

In the Event of a Crash

Although a minor fender-bender may seem to be a small matter, it should still



be reported to *Local Attorney* the police.

Crashes that seem to be minor at the time can develop into major problems later.

While many participants in car crashes may volunteer that they feel “perfectly fine” at the crash scene, some go on to belatedly experience crash-related symptoms.

With this potential complication in mind, experts strongly advise that people involved in crashes limit themselves to simply exchanging pertinent information.

A police report will provide important documentation for both insurance companies and lawyers should there be a need to identify the person or circumstances responsible for the crash.

The crash scene is no place for admissions of responsibility or accusations.

REMEMBER: While the facts are still fresh in your mind, write down the exact time, location, and other details of an accident so that you and your lawyer may refer to them later.
